OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF CIVIL AIR PATROL OWNED VEHICLES

CAPR 77-1, 1 September 1993 , is supplemented as follows:

Paragraph 4 d Added. Request for CAP Vehical Operator's permit will be made via FLWING F 3 (Request for CAP Vehicle Operator's Permit) or FLWING F 4 (Cadet Request Form to Drive CAP Vehicles). Form 3 or 4 must include the member's state drivers record transcript. These may be obtained by visiting your local Clerk of the Circuit Court and there may be a nominal cost incurred by the member. These can also be provided by various internet companies which specialize in providing on-line state drivers' license records.

Paragraph 15 Added. Each vehicle in the Wing will carry the following document in it vehicle log book:

1. Copy of Vehicle Registration, per FS 320.0605(original to be retained in vehicle folder)
2. A copy of the vehicle insurance identification card.
3. A supply of CAPF 73s (Daily CAP Vehicle Inspection Reports).
4. A supply of CAPF 78s (Mishap Report Forms).
5. A listing of emergency contacts for mishap reporting.
6. A copy of the communications frequency listing

Paragraph 4 a (2) Added. Members who hold CAP drivers' licenses will have their State of Florida drivers' license checked annually for the required validity and their drivers' records will be accessed through the Florida Department of Motor Vehicles on-line services to screen for major violations and citation patterns over the preceeding 2-year period which could negatively impact their continued issuance of a CAP drivers' license. If violations are found which determine that a CAP drivers' license is to be revoked, notice of revocation will be sent to the member by return-receipt mail. Notice to the members' unit commander will also be sent in the same manner.

Paragraph 8 b Added. Vehicle custodians will insure that oil changes are performed every 3,000 miles to insure the best possible condition of vehicle at all times. Tire Kingdom oil change vouchers my be obtained from the Wing Transportation Officer to be redeemed at the local Tire Kingdom location. These vouchers are furnished to vehicle custodians at no charge to the unit. If a unit does not have a Tire Kingdom in the lcoal vicinity, it will remain the duty of the unit to pay for the oil changes locally.

Spare tires for vehicles will be kept in a serviceable condition and are required for all standard vehicles. Excepted, are vehicles such as ambulances or other commercial vehicles which do not have provisions to carry spare tires or which the replacement of such tire needs to be accomplished by commercial tire repair shops.
